


L AFC BANC STADIUM




THE BFG

characters are interesting because they are from different Kingdom's and they are different colors and are really unique.




GREEN EGGS AND HAM

a difficult subject to teach because many things cannot be shown in real life. When cells are animated, their interaction with each other can be made clear to make the explanation of a biological process far simpler."






MUSICAL ROCKS


THE RANCH GARDEN




FUN WRITER'S NEW BOOK

it into singing auditions and how he failed, but next year made it. We got to watch them do a performance for us. It was very great and I really enjoyed watching them sing.


